Ambassador's Body Found in Elevator

New York, UPI. While survivors stood sobbing on the sidewalks below, firemen mopped up the remnants of a devastating fire that engulfed the top ten stories of the United Nations Secretariat.

Investigators are combing the ruined interior of the 29th to the 39th floors, and several witnesses are being sought in the hopes that someone will know the reason or events that contributed to the fire and the untimely death of John Bolton, Ambassador to the UN, whose charred body was found in an elevator stopped at the 29th floor.

"We're not ruling out anything", quipped Battalion Chief Vern Broadway. "Our investigation so far has revealed that the primary cause of the explosion was a gas leak somewhere in the building."
