NBPD Restores Order, Cancels Concert

North Bergen, UPI. -- The appearance of the klezmer band, The Booty Boys, at Curry Arena last night got off to a rocky start when an electrical problem prevented the fab three from taking the stage. The fans, many who had been waiting in line since Tuesday, when tickets first went on sale, became restless very quickly and what was a pre-concert festive atmosphere began to turn ugly. Many of the fans were young preteen girls who had won tickets to attend the concert, and the chaperones accompa-

nying them were simply outmanned and overwhelmed when the girls stormed the stage screaming. The Booty Boys manager, Hal Lindfield, was at a loss for words when asked why the fans were characterized by the NBPD as worse than English soccer hooligans.

"We regret any inconveniences our technical problems caused," said Lindfield.

When asked if fans would receive refunds, he replied, "We're looking into it".
