CHIMP CLONES IN CUSTODY Latest Suspects in War on Terrorism

Undercover officers of the North Bergen Police Department have captured several of the so-called "talking" chimps that terrorized North Bergen recently and government officials are reportedly performing a battery of tests on the animals to determine their intelligence quotients, and if found to have higher level cognitive skills, they will be moved to a federal research facility.

Big Finger Industries has begun distribution of its Magic One-Fingered Glove to retailers throughout the New York and New Jersey metropolitan area. The novelty glove was the brainchild of Lutz O'Toole, who, while driving in frigid winter traffic, suffered frostbite while constantly displaying the traditional one fingered salute.

In order to avoid another frozen digit, he formed his own start-up company and filed for a patent that was granted this week.
